SCRIPTURE READINGS

Col. 1:12-18 & Gal. 4:22-31

BRETHREN: Giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness, and translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the first-born of every creature: For by him were all things created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created by Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in him all things consist. And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence. It is written that Abraham had two sons, the one by a bondmaid, the other by a freewoman. But he who was of the bondwoman was born according to the flesh, but he of the free-woman was by promise. These things are symbolic, for these are the two covenants: The one is from Mount Sinai, which gives birth to bondage; which is Hagar. For this Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia and corresponds to Jerusalem as it is now, and is in bondage with her children. But the Jerusalem which is above is free, and is the mother of us all. For it is written: "Rejoice, O barren, You who do not bear! Break forth and shout, You who are not in labor! For the desolate has many more children than she who has a husband." Now we, brethren, as Isaac was, are the children of promise. But, as he was born according to the flesh then persecuted him who was born according to the Spirit, even so it is now. Nevertheless what does the Scripture say? "Cast out the bondwoman and her son, for the son of the bondwoman shall not be heir with the son of the free-woman." So then, brethren, we are not children of the bondwoman, but of the free.

Luke 17:12-19 & Luke 8:16-21

AT THAT TIME: Jesus entered a certain village, there met Him ten men who were lepers, who stood afar off. And they lifted up their voices and said, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" So when He saw them, He said to them, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And so it was that as they went, they were cleansed. And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, returned, and with a loud voice glorified God, and fell down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks. And he was a Samaritan. So Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine? Were there not any found who returned to give glory to God except this foreigner? And He said to him, "Arise, go your way. Your faith has made you well."

"No man, when he has lighted a candle, covers it with a vessel or puts it under a bed, but sets it on a candlestick, that they who enter in may see the light. For nothing is secret that shall not be made manifest; neither any thing hid that shall not be known and come abroad. Take heed therefore how ye hear, for whosoever hath, to him shall be given; and whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he seem to have." Then came to Him His mother and His brethren, and could not come near Him because of the crowd.



And it was told to Him by certain ones, who said, "Thy mother and thy brethren stand outside, desiring to see thee." And He answered and said unto them, "My mother and My brethren are these who hear the Word of God, and do it."
